Clean Water Fund Priority List

Overview:

The Department of Energy & Environmental Protection (DEEP) is preparing the Clean Water Fund Priority List (Priority List) covering FY 2018 and FY 2019 (7/1/17 – 6/30/19) and is requesting that you review and update the information which is currently on file.

Verify Project Needs:

- If your project is on the current FY 2016 & FY 2017 Priority List, please review costs and schedule and update the information for our records. The Priority List can be viewed at www.ct.gov/deep/cleanwaterfund and by clicking on “Final FY2016 - FY2017 Clean Water Fund Priority List”. Please note, projects on the FY 2016 & FY 2017 Priority List will not automatically be carried forward to the FY 2018 and FY 2019 Priority List.
- If a project has been constructed through funds other than the Clean Water Fund, please inform DEEP of this fact as well.
- Review your community’s needs for funding between now and June 30, 2019 and submit the attached form to DEEP. If there have been any changes in cost or schedule, please let us know.
- Please submit the attached form by September 7, 2017.

What Happens Next?

From the information that you submit, a project priority point evaluation will be made by DEEP based upon the criteria in the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies. If you are requesting construction funding, it is critical that you provide a realistic schedule that factors in review and approval of the construction plans and specifications by local boards and DEEP, acquisition of all local and state permits, time required to appropriate local funding, and time to bid the project.

Please be aware that in addition to construction funding which is based upon the priority points of the project, there are numerous funding reserves which are not awarded based on priority points. Each funding reserve is for a particular purpose and is set at a level which balances the demand and supply of funding. Therefore, it is important for all projects, regardless of size or anticipated priority points, to be submitted to DEEP for our consideration.

Copies of the draft priority list and the public notice of the hearing will be distributed and posted as soon as they become available.
